About Downtown Fremont:

Fremont's mission is to create a downtown that serves as the City's social heart - where people can connect, communicate, and celebrate. When we talk about Downtown, we're referring to a 110-acre area anchored by Fremont City Hall and within walking distance to the Fremont BART Station. It is located north of Fremont Boulevard, south of Paseo Padre Parkway, west of Mowry Avenue, and east of Walnut Avenue -- and Whole Foods is an important anchor that will set the tone for Downtown development.

Currently, there are multiple development projects under way within the Downtown: Paragon apartments recently began leasing its 300 units. Also, there are two private mixed-use projects in the planning process that will potentially bring additional retail opportunities and over 500 residential units into the Downtown.

The City was also awarded a grant to construct the streetscape along Capitol Avenue that will be the pedestrian and retail spine of the Downtown with widened sidewalks, added landscaping, street lighting, benches, bike racks, and additional free public parking. The grant will also be used to improve essential pedestrian and bicycle connectivity between BART and Downtown.

Parking Situation at Whole Foods:

The Whole Foods project has been a huge success with the Fremont community as well as for our neighboring cities. The current traffic and parking impacts are a direct reflection of that success.

Recognizing that the initial awe of Whole Foods would generate additional traffic and interest from patrons, it was anticipated that parking and traffic around the area would be impacted. To relieve these impacts, additional free public parking spaces can be located on Capitol Avenue just a short walk from the Whole Foods site. This area serves as an option to visitors and may help relieve some of the current strain.

In general, when any type of development application is submitted to the City for review it is evaluated against parking standards that are applied citywide. Parking space requirements are based on use type and amount of square footage of a building. The total amount of parking provided at the Whole Foods project meets those requirements.

It's not particularly unusual for any major retail development to create short-term parking impacts beyond what was planned. We are confident this will settle down in a short time period.
