Land Use Planning and Disaster Recovery* <i>(Sarah Karlinsky, Deputy Director, SPUR; Laurie Johnson, Consultant – Chair SPUR Land Use Planning and Disaster Recovery)</i></p> <p><i>SPUR, an urban planning public policy think tank, is working in coordination with ABAG to develop a strategy for addressing land use planning challenges during the recovery period after a major earthquake. We know that a major earthquake is going to present new land use planning and development challenges for local jurisdictions. A major earthquake will cause severe building and infrastructure damage and ground failures due to landslides, liquefaction and lateral spreading. Existing plans and codes may not provide a sufficient planning response to the damage a community will likely face. Additionally, the existing tools of planning may not be sufficient to address the challenges of rebuilding. While we cannot predict with precision where the challenges are going to be or all that they will entail, we do know that we need to begin planning now.</i></p> <p><i>SPUR seeks input from the RAWG on this project. We will focus on several areas related to long term rebuilding, including planning process, regulatory issues, financing, information and areas susceptible to multiple hazards.</i></p>	<p>9:40 a.m.</p>
