



Matt Maloney is the Director of Regional Planning for the Metropolitan Transportation Commission and Association of Bay Area Governments, spanning the 9-county Bay Area. Under Matt's leadership, the Regional Planning Program delivers a number of high-profile long range planning efforts, including Plan Bay Area 2050 and the Regional Housing Needs Allocation (RHNA). Prior to his role as Director, Matt served as Deputy Planning Director, and managed the strategic implementation of the MTC and ABAG staff consolidation in 2017.

Prior to MTC, Matt served as Deputy Chief of Staff for the Chicago Metropolitan Agency for Planning (CMAP), the metropolitan planning organization for the Chicago region. Matt got his start working in bicycle and pedestrian advocacy in Chicago, and received a Master's in Public Policy from the University of Chicago and a Bachelor's in Urban Studies from Brown University.

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Andrea Ouse, AICP is the Community Development Department Director for the City of Concord, overseeing Planning, Housing, Building, Engineering and Transportation functions. Since joining the City in 2017, she and her team have driven numerous multi-disciplinary efforts focused on a holistic approach to planning, transportation and capital improvements in the public realm, while creating more efficient and transparent methods of public service provision. Among the efforts include implementing online plan review and permitting, and GIS-based public webpages that provide real-time development information and capital improvement project details.

She and her team have secured substantial grant funds for complete streets implementation, deployed fiber technology in capital projects, and completed a major green infrastructure project to address stormwater runoff.

Prior to joining the City of Concord, Andrea was the Community and Economic Development Director for the City of Vallejo.

Andrea is a member of the California Planning Roundtable and is currently serving a third term on the State's Integrated Climate Adaptation and Resilience Program Technical Advisory Council (TAC).

Andrea is a native Californian and received her Bachelor of Science in City and Regional Planning from Cal Poly, San Luis Obispo and obtained her Master of Public Administration from California State University, East Bay.
