Vision of the Bay Trail


Goals:

- Class I AND Class IV protected lanes, quick build, protected intersections
- Access, Equity, System Integration




After 15 Years of Growth the Bay Trail Has Stalled


Gap Closure Implementation Plan: The Bay Trail has 70.6 Miles of Substandard Trails

37 miles have 1+ deficiency

33.6 miles have 1 deficiency

The most common types of deficiencies are:

- Poor pavement condition on 45.9 miles of trail
- Trail narrows/pinch point on 18.3 miles of trail
- Bollard/obstruction on 16.9 miles of trail
- General maintenance need on 5.3 miles of trail



Recent Bay Trail Nonprofit Challenges


- Steering Committee resignations Treasurer and Co-Chairs resigned; Chair retired in October 2023
- Lack of quorum for steering committee meetings
- Fundraising is not a priority or carried out
- Cannot meet the public support percentage required to maintain its non-profit tax status (diversity and number of smaller donations)
- 2 CFR 200 Incompatibility (Federal \$) with advocacy, fundraising and lobbying nonprofit functions






Senate Bill 100: Bay Trail Organizational Intent

- Created concept of continuous hiking/biking trail around the bay
- Directed ABAG to complete Bay Trail plan in 2 years
- Develop relationships w/agencies affected by Bay Trail
- Establish policy committee
- Establish advisory committee of env & rec orgs
- Funding not included
- Nonprofit not mentioned



New Structure

- Policy moves to Joint MTC Planning & ABAG Admin Committee
- Regional Agency TAC Bay Trail quarterly TAC comprised of MTC, BCDC, SCC & Caltrans focuses on alignment changes
- Advocates move to annual Bay Trail Gap Closure Implementation Working Group public meeting and/or Bay Area Trails Collaborative (BATC) for advocacy
- Annual Information Meeting includes all orgs & is led by MTC



- Discuss and build majority consensus for changes to the Bay Trail alignment
- Similar to current "administrative modifications"
- ROW owner brings forward proposed changes
- Ex-officio revolving agencies as appropriate





2. Bay Trail Program Informational Updates

- 1x per year
- General public, resource agencies +
 bicycle orgs
- Meets SB 100 requirement of "convening environmental and ecological protection of the bay and groups representing bicycling and other relevant recreational activities"










4D. MTC Agreement with BATC

- Meets with Rails-to-Trails staff 2x/year to discuss trails legislative agenda













- Includes major + delivery partners, cities, counties, CMAs, Federal resource agencies






