6.b. <u>19-0216</u> Senate Bill 5 (Beall): Local-State Sustainable Investment Incentive Program

Establishes a new mechanism to use local property tax revenue for affordable housing, infrastructure and sea-level rise mitigation, among other purposes.

**6.c.** <u>19-0217</u> Senate Bill 128 (Beall): Removal of Vote Requirement for Enhanced Infrastructure Financing Districts

Eliminates the current requirement for an enhanced infrastructure financing district to obtain voter approval prior to issuing bonds backed by future property tax growth.

This bill would specify that, on and after April 1, 2019, for the purpose of being subject to state and local taxes a retailer engaged in business in this state includes any retailer that, in the preceding calendar year or the current calendar year, has a cumulative sales price from the sale of tangible personal property for delivery in this state that exceeds \$500,000.
