4. SNAPSHOT OF NEW LEGISLATION BEING PROPOSED FOR 2014 LEGISLATIVE **SESSION**

Under Discussion of 2014 Legislative Session and introduction of new bills, Director Ezra Rapport gave a report on the status of the funding bill SB 391 (De Saulnier) California Homes and Jobs Act of 2013 which is sitting in the Appropriations Committee Suspense File. Amendments have been suggested that would possibly move this bill forward but have not

been finalized in print—we are watching closely to see what our next steps will be whether to support this bill or see what could be included in other bills.

SB 792: Regional Entities: San Francisco Bay Area

DeSaulnier's bill which stalled in last year's session was amended January 13th and again talks about the regional agencies, Joint Policy Committee, requiring a multiplicity of reporting requirements. Because it is impractical and bureaucratic, as well as unnecessary since the JPC are already engaged in many of the requirements, the Committee recommended OPPOSE at this time, with more discussion to follow.

5. 2014 LEGISLATIVE WORKSHOP AND RECEPTION

Legislative Workshop and Reception in Sacramento will be held Wednesday, February 26th at the CSAC Conference Center from 2-5pm, with a Reception following at Ella's (a block from the workshop location.

An agenda of legislators presenting bill and issue briefings is being finalized and will be sent to all. The goal is to bring together legislators and Bay Area elected officials and other agency stakeholders to informally discuss the day's issues and challenges. The cosponsors for this event are California Association of Counties (CSAC) and just confirmed the Metropolitan Transportation Commission.

6. ANNUAL ELECTION OF CHAIR AND VICE CHAIR

For 2014 Alameda County Supervisor Scott Haggerty was elected L&GO chair, with Oakland Councilmember Desley Brooks elected Vice Chair. (5-0)
